	5) Ensure students are NOT between the boat and water whilst the boat is moving down/up the		
	slipway.		
	6) Trolley to be stowed neatly away from the launch area.		
	7) Return to shore when directed to do so or at specified time and when landing area is clear.		
	8) Ensure sails are secure in dinghy before loading boat onto trolley, and then bring trolley/boat		
	ashore.		
	9) Clean boats and equipment as necessary		
	10) Check dinghy for seaworthiness, report damage to SI, record damage as appropriate.		
	11) Stow equipment in correct locations in stores		
	12) Return boat to its correct space, replace cover and tie down.		
	13) Buoyancy aids, helmets, spray suits and harnesses returned to store		
	14) Debrief students, update progress chart if/as appropriate		
	15) Attend SI/Instructor debrief		
Sailing	1) Tuition of all manoeuvres/ techniques will be by the RYA method.		
	2) Stay within the designated sailing area		
	3) Ensure students keep arms and legs inside the boat when in close proximity to other boats and		
	pontoon.		
	4) Ensure boom height is appropriate for the student (Pico & Wayfarer)		
	5) Teach land drills as and when required
